Resistance

An interactive, drama-documentary and an immersive audio-video experience, influenced by the Nazi programme of mass-murder targeting disabled people and - importantly-disabled people's resistance to it. Based on real events, this is the story of one woman's resistance in the only way she could. Award-winning writer-director Liz Crow's previous work has been shown at Tate Modern, the British Film Institute and a controversial appearance on the Fourth Plinth in Trafalgar Square, as part of sculptor Antony Gormley's One & Other project

Related Schools Workshop "If I could do just one thing..."

The workshop will focus on 'digital' and social media and it's power to enable citizen voice. Taking inspiration from the installation, young people will create blogs, tweets & images to raise their own 'issues', and counter negative propaganda and stereotypes. Examining the power that networks and self publishing can give (e.g. Arab Spring) that wasn't available to oppressed people during the Second World War. "What [one thing] would you have posted/done had you been a victim of Nazi oppression, but had access to the internet?' Led by Full Circle Arts.

Wood **Sculpture**

A collection of abstract wood sculptures many of which were carved using a chainsaw, sanded down with power tools and then finely hand sanded to highlight the beauty of the grain and produce a super smooth tactile finish. Based in South Manchester Rachel works with reclaimed local wood.

Students will meet the artist and learn about her creative process. Inspired by the exhibition participants will develop sketches and turn these into repeating patterns focussing on shape, line, form, texture and colour. They will then create their own sculptural pieces working with different materials and document the process in our Gallery for the next school.

Dance and poetry workshops will be available that explore the themes of the exhibition and link to the Dance & English curriculum


Creative History Workshops


