Associate Artist opportunity

Join the welcoming party! MIF, Theatre-Rites and Z-arts are looking for six freelance artists to work with them on an enrichment programme around the world premiere of new commission, *The Welcoming Party* (4 – 16 July).

Background to the production

Theatre-Rites – one of Europe's most imaginative theatre companies – will be giving a warm welcome to new arrivals as part of immersive show *The Welcoming Party*. Audiences will embark on an exciting journey through a historic hidden warehouse at the Museum of Science & Industry, walking alongside people who have travelled here from towns and cities far beyond Manchester, all looking for a place where they can feel safe.

The Welcoming Party will be a beautiful blend of puppetry, performance, dance and live music for both children (aged 8+) and family audiences.

Enrichment Programme

Thanks to a recent grant from the Granada Foundation we are able to deliver a programme of participatory activity for over 540 children (aged 8-12) promoting awareness and understanding of the key themes of the production – such as displacement, immigration, asylum, difference and home.

We are looking to appoint **6 Associate Artists** with diverse heritage; including, but not limited to, Syrian, Sudanese, Nigerian, Iraqi and Moroccan who specialise in the fields of **music**, **dance**, **performance** and **puppetry** – to be linked with 18 schools (three per Artist) across Greater Manchester to explore students' thoughts and feelings on these issues.

Associate Artists will have the opportunity to work alongside members of the Theatre-Rites creative team as part of an intensive training weekend. Each Artist will then be partnered with schools to form – through their own artistic medium and newly-created resources – a creative response with pupils to the question: why do you want to join the welcoming party?

The programme will culminate in students attending a schools' performance of *The Welcoming Party* during the Festival.

Programme Timeline

Applicants must be able to commit to the following **essential** dates:

- Saturday 6 May & Sunday 7 May training weekend with Theatre-Rites at Z-arts
- Between Monday 5 June and Wednesday 28 June Delivery of three half-day workshops in schools across Greater Manchester. (Workshop dates within this time to be negotiated between school and artist).

A fee of £700 will be paid to each Associate Artist to cover the training weekend, prep time and workshop delivery costs.

Person Specification

This is a creative, hands-on role and the successful candidate will be able to demonstrate the following:

- i. Experience of working with young people (a current DBS certificate must be held by all applicants);
- ii. Experience of working with schools;
- iii. Demonstrable excellent artistic facilitation skills;
- iv. High quality artistic practice in the fields of dance, movement, puppetry, music or other related performance arts;
- v. Strong planning, communication and organisational skills;
- vi. Ability to exercise initiative, work with minimum supervision and take personal responsibility;
- vii. Ability to work well in a diverse team and cooperate with others;
- viii. Excellent time keeping skills, conscientious and punctual;
- ix. An understanding of equal opportunities practices and interest in enabling more people to experience the arts:
- x. Experience of working in a creative environment or arts venue.

Applying for the role

The Welcoming Party is an opportunity for six artists to creatively respond with their allocated schools to the question, why do you want to join the welcoming party?

To apply for this position, you should outline your experience and knowledge in working with 8-12 year olds; in delivering creative participation; and how you will use your diverse heritage to explore this question through participatory workshops in school. You should also include in which artistic medium you would create the response.
