Black History Month

October is Black History Month and as well as our normal offer of African dance & drumming, storytelling and visual arts, we are offering fantastic cultural workshops teaching and exploring the history of Capoeira.

The origin of Capoeira began with African slaves sent to Brazil who developed games and ritual as one way to overcome the hardship of slavery and the sorrow of losing their family and culture. Today Capoeira is a playful game which combines music, singing and movements and honours the people who created it over 400 years ago.

Z-arts is offering the opportunity for schools to discover the history and culture of African slaves in Brazil through two different Capoeira education offers:
